Because of his awakening the whole world awakens. Because of His victory over sin and death we are all victorious. I had a conversation the other day with an individual who is struggling over their relationship and understanding of God. They have become overwhelmed by all of the information, halftruths, and misinformation out there regarding who or what is God, about which religion, if any, is right, and what about self-awareness? The discussion focused around what to believe, what is right and how do you know if it is right. I did my best to work the conversation around to a discussion about faith. Whether we want to admit it or not everyone has faith in something. Somethings require a great detail of understanding to believe, others not so much. I have faith that when I fly in an airplane that the pilot knows what he is doing, my faith is in the pilot. The pilot has faith in the training and thousands of hours that he has flown so that he can safely get me to my destination. I guess personally, even though I am not 100% sure, but I think it may be the passenger, because they have the least control over any of the process. In a sense, when I step on that plane I have no control over anything except perhaps where I want to sit, all the rest has been and will be taken care of for me. This brings me to Mark 10:15 "Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." Jesus is talking about faith, our only requirement is to believe, and not only believe, but believe as a little child. In last Sunday's sermon I mention how children can be so trusting, we tell them "jump and I will catch you", they believe, they trust, they jump. Simple right? The Eight T's of Stewardship

The Eight T's are: **Time, Talent, Treasure, Testimony, Touch, Tissue, Trash, and Technology.** You know the first three; the last four go like this: testimony (Christian witnessing), touch

(relationships), tissue (care of our bodies), trash (care of God's creation), and technology (our use of the electronic devices and tools with which God has blessed us) We will take one "T" each month.

TALENT

Our TALENTS include the gifts, skills and abilities that God has given to us. We often hear people talking about their "God-given abilities." And this is right on target because all we are and have is a gift from a good and gracious God.

Our TALENTS include the gifts that God has entrusted to us. The 12th chapters of Romans and 1 Corinthians speak about some of these gifts and remind us that the Holy Spirit gives various gifts according to His will, and He desires that we use these gifts for the common good (1 Peter 4:10).

Using our God-given TALENTS wisely and well produces the fruit of the Spirit that Paul mentions in Galatians 5:22: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."

Just as God provided skilled workers to help with the building of the Old Testament tabernacle and temples, so He continues to bless His people today with special gifts and skills to be of service in ways that honor God and bless others. We are members of the body of Christ (in our congregations) and each of us has TALENTS to put to work within that body so that it may be built up to be the worshipping, witnessing and serving community that God intends.

Dear Reader: This devotional was written in 2013. However, in 2019, we face new challenges that call for human kindness and a generous measure of God's grace. Be blessed in Him.

Kind of a crazy Friday. The news media is zoomed in on the "lockdown" in Boston as law enforcement works hard to find the "second" marathon bomber in the suburb of Watertown. There are reports of weapons, swat teams, locked doors, vacant streets, epicenter locations, neighborhood sweeps, switched-off cell phones, search dogs, evacuations, blank windows, robots, frayed emotions... all alongside the kindness of those who show up to help out.

While in Ashland, we are caught in a "shutdown" from a heavy-wet snowstorm. Walking is a chore, driving is sluggish, branches are falling, power-lines at risk, birds are hungry, shoveling is slow-going, no newspaper delivery, no shoppers on main street, dogs hang close to home, gusty winds, all alongside the kindness of those who show up to help out.


Other folks are engaged in another type of lockdown. Their epicenter is a medical facility, buzzers beep, electric beds, blood-pressure cuffs, wheelchairs and walkers, shots, IV-tubes, fresh pillows, telephone calls, get-well cards, all alongside the kindness of those who show up to help out.

When we think about it... "shutdowns" are a way of life for millions day-in-and-day out. The poor struggle for every meal, the refugee hopes for shelter, the nomad seeks water, the soldier dreams of home, the war-victims long for peace... and so much more. Millions are hoping kindness will show up to help out. I love what one speaker said yesterday at the faith service in Boston: Tragedy reveals Grace. That unique grace that is known in the kindness of others.

Grace is true in our journey of faith. The crazy-Friday tragedy of the cross revealed the holy Kindness of God. The kind-grace of forgiveness. The kind-grace of eternal hope. The kind-grace of deliverance. The kind-grace of healing. The kind-grace of bread. The kind-grace of living water. The kind-grace of shelter.

Boston will recover. Winter will give way to spring. And those who are sick will know relief.

In the grand scheme of things, maybe everyday is a crazy day. We wake up... we brush our teeth, comb our hair and move forward in the Resurrection Hope that we are empowered by God to face what comes each



day, but also gratefully surprised by the kindness of those who show up to help out.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Rick reported Sunday Worship/Lenten services going well. He appreciated the Best Practices conference in Arizona. He will be attending the District Conference at Camp Luther May 13 & 14. Pastor gave a presentation on **Pastoral Leadership Classes.** It is a 2 ½ year learning community to include five 3-day training immersions. Both Pastor and June would attend. The plan is to apply for a Siebert Grant to cover cost. The Council encouraged Rick to send in the application, and by July 15th the grant decision will be announced. Pastor will bring an update on this request to April Council meeting. Pastor also gave a report on **Red Letter Challenge** Bible study to begin after Easter. This is a 40-day study focused on the Words of Jesus; this series will include large group study and small groups.

Treasurer's Report: Motion to accept as printed by Warren. Second by Ellis. MMC.

Agenda Approval: Motion to accept by Guski with additions: Children's Bible at Baptism in Old Business. Red Cross request, and Palm Sunday Breakfast in New Business. Second by Warren. MMC.

Board Reports:

Trustees: Jarvela reported light-fixture ballast replaced. Shoveled scuppers. Ice issues addressed. Easement in progress with Excel energy. Paid first ½ of Pedestal for energy project. Plan to purchase back-up battery to keep on shelf. Mats will be laid when weather is warm.

Education: Lisa Guski will head up Summer VBS program. She has contacted Camp Luther. **LFOJ:** Guski reported Fundraisers in April: Dutch Mill Bulbs. Formal Parent/teacher conferences 3/11/19.

Evangelism: Ellis reported Easter baskets for home-bound will be completed on April 1, and distributed by Pastor and Team.

Motion to accept Board reports by Jarvela. Second by Warren. MMC.

Official Acts:

Baptism: Fynn Wright February 17, 2019

Motion to accept official acts by Warren. Second by Guski. MMC.

Old Business:

Bibles at Baptism: Children's Bible will be purchased and presented to child at baptism. Pastor Rick will follow up on this.

New Business:

Synod Membership Dues: \$1089 balance due- under "mission to Synod."

Red Cross request: After discussion, we feel our "downstairs" facility not suitable, but we will support Red Cross in Ashland, and encourage donations of blood. Motion by Jarvela. Second by Warren. MMC.

Palm Sunday Breakfast: Zion youth taking care of this. There will be a signup sheet and the offering to be used for summer youth conference.

Adjourn: Motion by Guski. Second by Jarvela. MMC.

The meeting closed with *The Lord's Prayer*. Council will meet again on April 15th, 2019, at 5:30 pm.
