Jesus wants to help us during our journey in this world. He died for our sins, he rose again for our salvation, he doesn't want us to go it alone. Take the time to let him in. It is a lesson for all of us. I was going to end with some profound statement but realized I could not say it any better than Hymn 770, "What a Friend we have in Jesus"; next time you are sitting in the pew and have a moment, simply read through all three verses, they say all that needs to be said.


Retro-Sunday Service

Stewardship Thoughts

Celebrating stewardship? That is a concept not heard at voters' meetings. The usual response is tune out, yawn, or how long is this going to last. Suggesting a celebration of stewardship is about an appealing as celebrating a root canal without Novocain.

Stewardship is something the individual steward and congregation should and can celebrate. Why? Because stewardship is not about us—what we do or decide to give or even how we decide to give. It is about the free and joyous activity of the church managing life's resources for His purposes. As James writes in the first chapter, verses 17-18, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth, that we should be a kind of first fruits of his creatures." Luther's explanation of the First Article of the Creed reminds us that our Father in heaven gives these gifts "only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy without any merit or worthiness in me." The Lord sets us, as His crown of creation, in a position to manage those gifts in a way that is pleasing to Him and joyful for us. Stewardship viewed from this perspective; how can one not celebrate stewardship.

The reason we struggle with stewardship is seen in Genesis chapter 3 in 'The Fall into Sin'. Rather than be stewards of the creation the Creator entrusted to us. We stole it from God and made it our own and we owned it. This was stated in the last month's newsletter. When we believe we own things, pride, selfishness and territorialism crowd God the Creator out of the picture. When God is moved out there can be no joy. Nothing we own can be maintained and decays through sin. This causes us stress and anxiety which robs us of the joy to celebrate anything in stewardship, as we place more value on things above the Lord who restored them.

As we move toward repentance, which is a gift from God, we can begin to celebrate stewardship as we shift from us to Him. As stated in 1 Cor. 5:17 "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The former things have passed away and everything has become new." We are forgiven of our ownership and restored by grace to stewardship.

As forgiven and restored stewards we are freed from the fear of losing. We are not lost, and look forward to the day when everything will be restored to the original Eden at the resurrection. Fully restored and forgiven through faith in Christ, how can we not celebrate?

The local congregation composed of those who have been redeemed and restored, gathered around. Word and Sacrament, are the new creation. The congregation is where the celebration of stewardship takes place. As we gather around the baptismal font, altar and pulpit, we the people of God are reminded by the Holy "Spirit why we can celebrate as stewards of God's good gifts. These gifts share the life-giving Gospel, support ministry, support families and community. We know why these gifts are given. Fatherly divine goodness and mercy and from whom they come—our Heavenly Father. Thinking thusly, we will start looking at every aspect of stewardship as something to be celebrated, which in turn brings more celebration. Let's start celebrating!

Labor Day is just around the corner and that signals the beginning of school in our area. But many children worldwide are not able to attend school simply because they do not have the required supplies. Education is the key to opening doors out of poverty.

Please donate items from the list below. You may donate all or just some of these items. There will be boxes in the conference room for your items.

(Note: you do NOT need to supply a backpack, just the school supplies, and you don't have to get the entire kit, parts of it will be fine.)

Each School Kit must contain the following items:

- 4 Notebooks (70 sheet, college or wide ruled)
- 1 Ruler (must have centimeters on one side)
- 1 Pencil Sharpener
- 5 Pencils (unsharpened)
- 1 Blunt Scissors
- 5 Ballpoint Pens (no gel ink, blue or black)
- 1 Box of Crayons (16 or 24 count)
- 1 Big Eraser

Past Missions: Samaritan's Purse \$233 Nets \$160 I wrote this devotional over five years ago, but once again a powerful wind swept over our *landscape at 4:30* a.m. toppling trees, and causing a major power outage. It seemed right to revisit this devotional.

The wind blows where it wills, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know whence it comes or whither is goes; so it is with every one who is born of the Spirit. John 3:8

Can't help but respect the power of wind when a powerful nor'ester blows in. The trees sway, dried weeds bend over, the sky roars, windows shudder, waves crash, and birds glide rather than fight the force of 50 mph gusts. The forecast was for a whopper snowstorm coming in from the southwest, but the nor'ester threw up a barrier and held back the snow-clouds. It was amazing to see once again how an energetic wind combs the landscape and sweeps out nature's snarls and tangles. Humans have developed ways to harness the wind, but so far there are no fail-safe methods when air is moving at high-power.

How beautiful it was that Nicodemus, a Jew, came by night and asked Jesus about the kingdom of God. Jesus sensed Nicodemus' inquiry came from his heart and Jesus spoke: Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen. John 3:11. And Jesus went on to debate how earthly examples point to the spirit-life of eternity. The Book of John does not reveals Nicodemus' response to his conversation with Jesus, but surely Nicodemus heard the sound of the Spirit. (It is worth noting that Nicodemus shows up later to place a generous mixture of spices in the linen cloths used to wrap the body of Jesus. John 19:39)

Although this night-time story does not have a tidy packaged ending, rarely does the wind leave everything in an orderly fashion. Some things are cleaned up by the wind, and other things are scattered. Likewise in the kingdom of God, the Spirit reorders lives and also turns lives upside down. The Spirit bends us and at other times forces us to glide. There is no earthly formula to predict the presence and force of the kingdom of God. Let the wind blow where it wills. For our call is to faithfully bear witness to what we know and have seen that others may hear and feel the eternal power of the Spirit.
