





# Zion Lutheran Church Council Minutes

November 18, 2013

The November 18, 2013 meeting of the Church Council was called to order by President, Chuck Chronis Vicar Williams opened the meeting with a devotion.

**ROLL CALL**: Chuck Chronis (President), Darryl Warren (Elder), Lynn Ladd (Education), Todd Vyskocil (Treasurer), Mary Koosmann (Financial Secretary), Penny Mattson (Stewardship), Becky Sapper (Secretary), Lori Hebert (Evangelism), Nick Jarvela (Trustees), Rick Williams (Vicar).

**MINUTES:** Motion by Ladd, second by Koosmann, to approve the minutes of the October 21, 2013 Council meeting as printed. Motion carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Motion by Jarvela, second by Ladd, to approve the Treasurer's Report as given. As of October 31, 2013 Zion had \$62,518.38 in checking, \$12,687.95 in savings and \$18,520.13 remaining on the loan. Motion carried.

**AGENDA:** Motion by Hebert, second by Mattson, to approve the agenda as printed with additions to new and old business. Motion carried.

**BOARD REPORTS:** Motion by Jarvela, second by Koosmann to accept the Board Reports as given. Motion carried.

Vicar's Report: Two baptisms and one funeral, bible studies and confirmation were conducted last week. Ashland Area Ministerial Association changed meeting time to accommodate Vicar Williams schedule, he will be preaching at area nursing homes every 7 weeks. The first term of schooling is completed for Vicar Williams, second term starts in two weeks. Advent and Christmas theme (Unto us a Child is Born) is planned. Vicar is continuing with LFOJ chapel and has started devotions with school aged children as well. The shut-in list is being updated (please share names of any shut-ins with the Vicar). Vicar Williams reviewed his past week with the Council and his days are very busy.

**Evangelism**: Fourteen care packages for Zion's college students are being created to help them prepare for finals and flu season.

**Trustees**: General monthly maintenance for Zion and LFOJ has been completed. Lawn mowers have been winterized and stored for the season. Church insurances have been renewed for 2014. Roof leaks have been repaired and scuppers have been cleaned of debris, heated traces have been turned on for the winter.

**OFFICIAL ACTS:** Motion by Hebert, second by Vyskocil to accept the Official Acts. Motion carried. **Baptisms**: Kennedy Jo Williams (11-16-13) and Cadence Rayne Williams (11-16-2013) **Deaths**: Kenneth Walter Philaja (11-06-13)

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- A. Motion by Mattson, second by Jarvela to accept the slate of candidates for open Board positions submitted by the nomination committee. Motion carried. There are currently no candidates for Council Secretary.
- B. Motion by Jarvela, second by Hebert to approve the 2014 budget to be presented to the membership on December 1, 2013. Motion carried.
- C. Approval from Trustees on the amendment to the Sexual Harassment /Abuse policy, they will inform Guide One Insurance. Trustees will look over the policy to determine if there are areas of the policy that need action (annual training for volunteers).

A request was made for gas/food cards to be given in emergencies for individuals calling for financial assistance. It was agreed that all individuals should be referred to the BRICK and we should not provide additional dollars out for non-members.

Council will sponsor a brunch potluck for after the annual meeting on December 1<sup>st</sup>. The agenda for the meeting will be provided the Sunday prior to the meeting, which will include Board Officer elections, 2014 Budget, Sexual harassment/Abuse policy, and Synodical vote on the name change of Circuit Counselor to Circuit Visitor.

Capital Projects Committee will begin meeting shortly to help provide a means for the congregation to make decisions on a list and prioritization of large expenses that are anticipated in the short-term and long-term.

Trustees are interested in purchasing a snow blower and installing a mailbox. No concerns raised by the Council for these two purchases.

ADJOURN: Motion by Jarvela, second by Vyskocil to adjourn. Motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
