I was reading through scripture the other day, 1 Timothy, one of my favorites, right after 1 Peter, and came across these verses: 1 Timothy ¹⁵ The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost. ¹⁶ But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life. ¹⁷ To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. So as we think of Paul's message to Timothy, "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost," we remember that we too are included in that list of sinners, and even though we are sinners, we have our Lord's assurance that, through our faith in Jesus Christ, we have been guaranteed to be together with Him for life eternal.

So as we prepare for Christmas and the celebration of the birth of our Savior I will try not to be cliché as I say; remember.... Jesus is the Reason for the Season.

June, Dylan, and I would also like to personally wish you all a very Merry Christmas. Please join us for Advent Services on Wednesday nights December 3rd, 10th, 17th, and Sunday December 21st. And Christmas Eve services at 4:00 PM and 7:00 PM, and Christmas morning services at 9:00 AM.

Blessings to all of you this Christmas season and I close with the words that in my opinion sum it up the best:

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

ORGAN FUND NEARING COMPLETION

POTLUCK CHRISTMAS DINNER PLANNED FOR 2ND SUNDAY IN DECEMBER

Excitement is building at Zion Lutheran Church as the Organ Fund at Zion nears its goal. While we are only \$4,700 from success, we have much for which to thank God.

- 1. It is a CONGREGATION effort, as was demonstrated at the last Organ Fund Dinner, organized and served by Katie Colgrove and the Sunday School girls (some guys too). Our thanks to everyone (and there were many) who helped to make that event a delicious success.
- **2. Many MEMORIALS and THANK-OFFERINGS** were donated by families of the congregation in loving memory of dear ones who have gone to be with the Lord and in gratitude for special blessings received from God. This also includes some families who permitted their unused Bell Tower memorials to be applied to the Organ Fund.
- 3. THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS that were not designated for anything else were now made available for the purchase of the new organ. Over \$16,000 was authorized by the Church Council for this effort. What a blessing! Just thinking about that helps a person realize what a blessing it can be for God and His Kingdom at Zion when in a similar way people may set aside in their Wills a portion for Zion Lutheran Church to be used for future kingdom needs.
- **4. PRAYERS and spiritual support are vital in this effort.** As St. Paul indicates in 2 Corinthians chapters 8 and 9, the believers gave themselves FIRST to the Lord and then to the Apostle to distribute to the saints in need in Jerusalem. Giving ourselves to God with FIRST-FRUITS remains a vital ingredient in the church. We are not just in the business of raising money for God; instead our generous giving is an indicator of the fact that we FIRST GIVE OURSELVES TO GOD and then to the effort of obtaining a NEW ORGAN to help us express our faith and joy in worship. It is the love of God made evident in the death and rising of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins that motivates believers to be generous. Just think how important it is for us to know that a loved one has departed this life in faith and peace and joy, because they knew that Jesus after His death and resurrection had gone ahead to prepare a place for them and that He opened the grave on the other side into Heaven.
- **5.** The FELLOWSHIP of Believers creates good will among Christians in a congregation as they lend support to one another in accomplishing great things for God. When we work together, and eat together, and pray together we grow in faith and joy as a congregation. As Acts 2 demonstrates, such actions cause other people to want to be part of the FELLOWSHIP of Believers. It is one of the most effective evangelism outreaches possible when people hear and see what God is doing among the Christian members of Zion Lutheran Church. It also helps us to get along with each other and put the best construction on everything when we sometimes get into squeaky spots in our failure to communicate adequately with each other. It teaches us to work together, pray together, sing together, and play together.

7. We are expecting the organ to be completed in January and installed in February. It would be exciting if we could dedicate the NEW ORGAN on February 15th, which is TRANSFIG-URATION SUNDAY, the last Sunday before Lent. Time will tell when the actual dedication will take place. We are hoping for an accomplished organist to give a concert on the new organ at that time as well. WHAT IF WE SURPASS OUR GOAL? Wouldn't that be great? Actually there will be some additional costs that extra money can fund. Some of these costs will be for electrical hook-up and alterations that may be needed. We have wanted to complete the ORGAN PROJECT without having to dip into our regular work program for expenses. Please continue to pray that we find a buyer for our present Pipe Organ, so that we can remove the present organ and pipes by the time the new organ is installed.

THANK YOU for all that you are doing for the Lord through this entire effort. And remember to thank God for all He is doing for us and through us. Keep praying and encouraging one an other in your faith.


New Business:
