Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The call to Pastor Smiles has been returned and the next call may take place on February 2nd. Doing a quick time line in my head indicates that I may continue to be your vacancy pastor through the Lenten Season and possibly through part of the Easter Season. I have said, from the beginning of my time as vacancy pastor of Zion, that I would serve in this capacity up to one calendar year ending in the middle of August 2012. Please continue to pray for the Call Committee as they continue to work diligently to have the vacancy filled.

The Lenten Season is a penitential time of the church year, where special emphasis is placed on the suffering and death of our Lord, Jesus Christ. This season begins this year on Wednesday, February 22 and is known as Ash Wednesday. The people of the Old Testament would cover themselves with sackcloth and put ashes on their heads to indicate that they were truly sorry for an act that they committed that could bring disaster or death to others. The Book of Esther records one of these incidents.

During the Lenten Season, special mid-week service will take place each Wednesday through March 28th. There are forty days in Lent. The Sundays are not counted, as they are celebrations of our Lord's resurrection. I would invite all to participate in these mid-week services as we prepare our hearts and minds knowing that Jesus died to redeem us from eternal death and suffering and paid for our sins on the cross at Calvary.

Knowing full well that I may serving you for awhile, plans have been made to insure regular services, adult instruction classes and Bible studies. I would like to thank all of you who have made this time of the vacancy a true blessing to both Diane and me. I look forward to meeting more of you and getting to know better those I have already met. God bless all of you!

We have to trust in God, knowing that He will send the right man to be your pastor according to His will, not ours. Again, pray for the Call Committee, the next pastor, and his family to whom a call will be extended. The peace of the Lord be with you always.

My first Valentine stories go way back...back to grade school days. As Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, he went out to meet people at beaches, hillsides, homes, temples, gardens, roadsides, parties, every place. He talked to the proud, the poor, the rich, the thief, the lame, the blind, the young, the old... soldiers, parents, teachers, everyone. Jesus walked and talked love to everyone-everywhere. No one was left out. As his course was set for Jerusalem, the story speeded up. For when the Cross was lifted up, the fullness of God's divine love was revealed: A perfect love that first loved us. January 16, 2012

The January 16, 2012 meeting of the Church Council was called to order by President, Chuck Chronis. Pastor Hyvonen opened the meeting with a devotion and prayer.

ROLL CALL: *President*: Chuck Chronis, *Elder*: Darryl Warren, *Trustee*: Jim Johnson, *Financial Secretary*: Mary Koosmann, *Education*: Lynn Ladd, *LFOJ*: Cheri Tamke, *Treasurer*: Todd Vyskocil, *Secretary*: Becky Sapper, *Stewardship*: Penny Mattson and *Pastor* Hyvonen.

MINUTES: Motion by Warren, second by Johnson, to approve the minutes of the December 19, 2011 Council meeting as printed. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Motion by Warren, second by Koosmann, to approve the Treasurer's Report as printed. Total assets as of 12/31/11 were listed as \$25,010.95. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Motion by Johnson, second by Warren, to approve the agenda with additions to new business. Motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS:

Motion by Johnson, second by Koosmann to accept the board reports as given. Motion carried.

Pastor: Six services were held between 12/21/11 and 1/15/12; All shut-ins, except one, were visited; Met with Confirmation classes twice; held three adult instruction classes; Made plans for two baptisms; held three bible studies; Met with potential new members, elders, Council president, Pastor Baumeister, and Lutheran Hour ambassador.

Elders: Elders will meet with the confirmands twice during the year; the first time will be in February.

Trustees: Held first meeting with new and returning trustees and discussed maintenance procedures and assignments. LFOJ is relocating to the office between Secretary and Pastor's office. A new rider mower and self-propelled push mower is being made available for use on the church property this summer by a benefactor who is also willing to sell the mowers to the church.

Financial Secretary: The end-of-the-year statements were either placed in church mailboxes or mailed during the first week of January.

Education: Four new individuals joined the one person education board. First meeting will be held on January 31 to review board responsibilities.

NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Board/Group assignments were made for serving each Lenten Soup and Sandwich Supper.
- B. Koosmann will review checks written by treasurer via the on-line account as a checks/balance at the request of the treasurer. Vyskocil also requested to be informed of a maximum dollar amount he was authorized to write for items not explicitly covered in budget. Sapper will review old minutes to see if this was discussed previously.

Motion by Johnson, seconded by Koosmann to present and endorse Pastor Hyvonen's negotiated salary request to the members at the next Voter's meeting for approval.

ADJOURN: Motion by Johnson, second by Warren to adjourn. Motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Emergency Closings

With winter upon us, we would like to remind parents of our emergency closing policy. In the event of school closing, preschool classes will be cancelled, but the daycare will remain open pending enough staff can arrive to meet state required staff-to-child ratios.

School-age children who were scheduled for before/after school care are given first priority, with other children being added as space is available. School-age parents should contact the center before coming to confirm that care is available, and that drop-off times are okay.

In inclement weather, the center may make the determination to close early or completely. Late Start Times or Emergency closings due to winter weather conditions will be announced on radio stations WJJH (96.7 FM) and WEGZ (93.3 FM) or the NBC Channel 6 News. For emergency conditions that arise during the day, parents will be contacted at work and asked to pick up the child as soon as possible.

Preschool News

It's wonderful to be starting out the new year with our preschool friends. Thank you again for your thoughtfulness, remembering our staff during the Christmas season. And hats off to our kids for putting on a fabulous Christmas program...we hope you enjoyed it as much as we did!

As we kick off 2012, our first month is filled with many fun themes. We begin with "Time for Bed", a kid-favorite. Check your calendar for our Pajama Days. Our Jesus time will talk about Joseph escaping in the night with Mary and Jesus, to avoid wicked King Herod.

Next, is our Transportation unit (another favorite, especially for our boys). We'll be talking about planes, trains and any thing else on wheels. We'll be heading over for our monthly Chapel visit.

The week of the 16th is our "Winter Wonderland" theme. Hopefully, we will continue to get more snow, as the children are enjoying using the new sleds the center got as gifts. We'll do a science experiments, watching snow melt and making frost. Our Bible story for the week will be Jesus' baptism. Just a reminder, there will be no preschool on Friday, 1/20.

The following week is our Ocean Life theme, as we hear how Jesus called a number of fishermen to follow him.

Finishing off the month, we'll talk about our Five Senses. At Jesus time, our preschoolers will hear how Jesus cares about our needs when he heals a blind man.

It is our attempt to get outside each day with our preschoolers. It works best for us to take the children outside at the beginning of our preschool session. If the temperature is a little on the chilly side, we may wait until the last 15 minutes. Please allow the children to get dressed at home with little or no help. (Imagine trying to help 10 preschoolers get dressed for outside play.) This is great practice for them for school. They may surprise you how much they are able to do by themselves.
