Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Have you caught on yet that the more I have to write about the smaller the size of the font I use to fill the page. This month I believe the font will be a little smaller, I have a number of things to fill you in on.

On January 24th Sandy Frisco, Lynn Ladd, and I went to Trinity Church in Ironwood to attend the district leadership conference. The opening was just that; very eye opening. Following the opening we went into breakout sessions to talk about a variety of topics. One of the most unsettling things for me was President Lueck's talk about the size of the churches in the North Wisconsin District. In the NW District there are 218 congregations, as of 2012, 56% or 126 of those congregations had an average Sunday worship attendance of 100 or less. 41 of those congregations worship 35 or less each Sunday.

Another interesting fact was that as of 2012 the second largest religious affiliation was "none", 19.3% of the adult population of the United States checked the box that said no religious affiliation or "none". There was only one group larger and that was Roman Catholics at just over 20%, Lutherans were well down the list. Further it was stated of those that checked "none" the largest subsection was those under 30 years of age at 32%. So to put those numbers in prospective 1 in 5 adults and 1 in 3 adults under 30 have no religious affiliation. I found those numbers amazing and disturbing; however, it certainly helped to explain the drop in church attendance. It also points to the growing number of people who need to hear about the Saving Grace of our Lord and Savior.

So what can we do about it? There lies the challenge. In the session I attended, and the general theme of the conference was exactly that; what are the goals for your church? Before we could leave we were required to submit a goal for our church, not only did we have to submit a goal, but we also had to list a time frame for the accomplishment of the goal and our contact information so President Lueck could follow up and check on our progress toward our goal. The goal we selected for Zion; bring our average Sunday worship numbers back up to 125. One of the key elements of a goal is it has to be achievable; I believe this is an achievable goal. I do not believe it is a goal that I or any one person could achieve. However if we work together, as we have been hearing over the past several weeks, if we work together as the Body of Christ, it is a goal we can achieve. And when we reach that goal, we can set another, and then another. I look forward to working with all of you as we work to attain that goal.

That's enough on that for now, if you would like to learn more about the conference and what we learned please come talk to us.

The other thing I wanted to start letting you know about was the upcoming Lent services. This year for the Wednesday Lenten services we are going to be looking at The Trials of Jesus, each week as we go through Lent the message will be from the prospective of Jesus' accusers, starting with the Voice of Satan on Ash Wednesday, followed by Judas, Annas, Caiaphas, Herod, and then Peter. There are also connected services for Holy Week, I am really excited about this program and hope you will all attend. Also don't forget the soup and sandwich dinner before each service. It all starts Ash Wednesday, February 13th at 5:30 p.m.

The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you and thank you.



- 1. Seven scholarships, each in the amount of \$1,000, will be awarded to seven graduating high school seniors or current full-time post-secondary students at an accredited institution with at least one year of courses remaining. Candidates must also be members of a congregation belonging to the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod located in one of the following districts: lowa East, lowa West, Minnesota North, Minnesota South, North Dakota, North Wisconsin or South Wisconsin.
- 2. The application **deadline** is **April 1, 2013**—all applications must be postmarked no later than this date. The applicant's name must be on each page of the scholar-ship material submitted. Applications will not be considered valid unless all material requested is submitted with the application.

The scholarship will be awarded on merit and need, and distributed following successful completion of one semester (or term) at the accredited institution the student is attending.

VOTERS' MEETING - Sunday, February 10th

(Following the service)

There will be a <u>discussion</u> and possible vote on the Specific Ministry Pastor Program (SMP) which is an additional option available to Zion to fill our vacancy. In 2007 the LCMS Convention passed the SMP Program which is designed to meet the need for pastors for mission and ministry in the Church where a pastor with a seminary degree might not be available. These men are identified by the ministry and mission opportunity where they will serve in consultation with their district president. It is a designated type of ministry, declared at the outset. Rick Williams has expressed a desire to commit to this program. When his application is submitted and accepted, Rick would begin a 4 year program designed by the St. Louis Seminary. He would serve a 2 year Vicarage beginning as early as April 2013, continue his education while serving us and be ordained after that vicarage is completed. He would then need to complete 2 additional years of study to complete his training. This four year program would all be completed at Zion. More information will be available at the meeting.
