Stewardship is an important part of LCMS theology. Stewardship begins with the cross and responds freely and joyously in thanksgiving to everything the Lord does for us. Out theology is biblically rooted, doctrinally sound, and historically based to lead us to live God-pleasing lives of stewardship. We are only limited by the gifts that are given us by the Lord. We must take care that we do not focus on things other than the cross – not budgets, mortgages, or paying the bills.

Our approach should not be needs-based but must flow from the Gospel which we receive through the preaching and teaching of scripture. We are not reguired by the Law to be stewards but are created and redeemed to be stewards. St Paul describes stewardship life in Romans 12 as a practice that flows first from the mercies of God.

Our faith invites us to enter the woods with those who feel caught by the events of life... that we may walk and talk the promises of the Creator. For even in the woods we see the presence of God in the spring sprouts of hope, the full-bloom of summer mercy, the autumn mulch of grace, and the snow-plowed path of hope. The God of earthly landscape is committed to the 24×7 stories of His people. He is ever-ready and ever-eager to surprise those stuck in the woods with His goodness and peace.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Motion by Warren, second by Hebert, to approve the Treasurer's Report as printed. As of December 31, 2013 Zion had \$80,451.76 in assets and \$18,338.76 in liabilities. Motion carried. **AGENDA:** Motion by Jarvela, second by Koosmann, to approve the agenda as printed with additions to new

business. Motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS: Motion by Jarvela, second by Hebert to accept the Board Reports as given. Motion carried. *Vicar's Report:* Advent services and Christmas services completed. All shut-ins visited before Christmas. One baptism and four funerals were performed. Confirmations classes continue and are going well. First SMP class complete, halfway through second class. Communications with Cross Roads regarding public dinner.

Evangelism: Committee meeting February 12. Planning new member celebration and summer picnic. **Elders**: Planning to meet with confirmation students. Elders will be meeting first Sunday of each month. **Trustees**: Attention to roof leaks. Continued maintenance at LFOJ.

Education: Planning Secret Pal gathering in combination with Mother / Daughter event. Discussion / planning of women's ministry, currently looking and considering materials. Sunday school is going well. *Financial Secretary*: Nothing to report.

Stewardship: Nothing to report

LFOJ: Discussion of Health Insurance as it relates to the health care exchange.

Penny Mattson brought requests for additional tables and chairs for large group events as well as new carafes for serving. Decision was made to move forward with tables and chairs and continue researching carafes. Also request for someone to serve as Event Controller to oversee duties during funerals, baptisms etc. Listing of responsibilities to be posted in newsletter and on bulletin board. In addition, Chuck Chronis volunteered to fulfill janitorial duties as needed for the special events if staff janitor is not available. Lastly, decision was made to purchase two new vacuum cleaners.
