Sometimes, the hardest part of writing a newsletter cover is figuring out how to start. What message do I want to convey this month? How best to get that message across? As I started this one, I began to realize how that reminds me of the apostle Paul and the challenge he faced as he shared the Gospel of Jesus Christ to people of so many different backgrounds around the world. To those of the Jewish faith he looked to the law and the prophets, to the gentiles he spoke of the world and creation and of the God that in their hearts they knew existed, but yet, they never understood. Much like Paul speaking at the Areopous as he let the learned Greeks know who the unknown God they were worshiping was; the God, the God of Creation, the God that in our world to-day our challenge isn't that different from Paul's. We have the same mission as Paul, the mission given to us by Christ himself in the last chapter of Matthew; ^{w19}Go there-

fore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," (Matt 28:19). If you have a red-letter Bible you will see these are the words of Jesus, it is not a suggestion, he's not saying maybe you should consider this, it is a command! As Christians, because of what our Lord and Savior did for us, our charge is to share that message with the world. If you have been following my readings in Acts you will see that the Apostles were doing that very thing. And guess what? Not everyone who heard that message welcomed it. So, it shouldn't surprise us when not everyone one in our world welcomes it. I might even go so far to say that some parts of our world welcome it even less today. Heck, I might even go so far as to say that people in this country welcome it less. To hear and welcome the message that we deliver, people have to give up something of themselves. They have to give up the idea that they are the most important thing in their lives. They have to admit that they are sinful by nature and are in need of forgiveness. They have to give up the idea that they determine what is right and wrong. They have to admit that there is something, someone, out there who is bigger than they are. God. They also must come to an understanding that while they do indeed have to give things up, the things that they will receive far exceed any and all of the earthly things they have clung to. Now I

Now I will be the first to admit our task of sharing the message of salvation is not an easy one, if you don't believe me, ask Paul, or any other of the countless martyrs who have perished sharing that word. But that doesn't mean we stop trying, or even that we get to slow down. Now more than ever sharing the word is more important. Everyday is a day closer to Christ's return and the final judgement. We must share the Gospel message. Now you might ask what can I do? I don't know my scripture as well as I should, I feel uncomfortable talking to people, I am scared. First and foremost, you need not be scared! As one of my favorite Christian song says, "The God of angel Armies is on my side", or as Paul says "If God is for us, who can be against us". Christ himself tells the apostles and us, that when the time comes, do not be worried about what to say, for the Holy Spirit will speak for you and through you (paraphrase). Besides, we don't all have to all preach scripture, we don't all have to stand on a soapbox and spread the word. We can share God's word simply by the way we live our lives. How we reflect God's love in our everyday words and actions. So, stand tall, know that the Lord stands with you and share His love with those around you. Believe me, you all know that his world and this country need all of His love that they can get. So be like Paul, share the message in the best way that you can and then when all is said and done you too can say; "⁷ I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. ⁸ Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing."

I pray that God watches over each and every one of you and that you are all safe and well. I pray that soon we can all worship again in His presence in His Church. Living in the Spirit Is God's Choice for Me

In the Word

"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit — fruit that will last." John 15:16a

Of the Word

Life is filled with choices — what car to drive, what clothes to buy, which TV channels to watch, which foods to eat. Sometimes the choices bring satisfaction, and sometimes they bring great disappointment.

In and of ourselves, there is one choice we cannot make. We cannot choose God. Instead, Jesus assures us, *I chose you* ... It is the Holy Spirit who enables us to hear God's call.

And what is our response? We know how to handle life's other choices: we drive the car, we wear the clothes, we laugh and learn from TV, we get nourishment from foods. Our response to God's choice is to follow His direction, ... go and bear fruit ...

The fruit may be as simple as smiling at the harried supermarket clerk or helping the toddler get his shoes on the right feet. Hey, colleague, make a big deal out of the 14th. Express your love genuinely. "Husbands, love your wives" (Col. 3:19).


