Green is the color for the Epiphany Season representing Christian life and growth in faith. An epiphany is a revelation or a bringing forth. Some would describe it as an "aha" moment or "I get it now".

Jesus was revealed to the people of His day in many ways. John the Baptist announced Jesus' beginning of his active ministry. John said, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie?" After John baptized Jesus, immediately he saw the heavens open and the Spirit of God descending on Jesus like a dove. "And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased". We are not sure how many people witnessed this event but many believed that this was the promised Messiah.

Jesus comes to us every day even though we do not see Him. He is with us through His Word, the Holy Scriptures, through Holy Baptism and through the Lord's Supper. He also hears our prayers and pleads for us to our heavenly Father. Jesus is the light that shines in this dark world of sin. The December 19, 2011 meeting of the Church Council was called to order by President, Nick Jarvela, who opened the meeting with a prayer.

ROLL CALL: President – Nick Jarvela, President elect – Chuck Chronis, Trustee – Jim Johnson, Education – Dawn Reardon, Secretary – Becky Sapper, Stewardship – Penny Mattson, LFOJ – Cheri Tamke.

MINUTES: Motion by Johnson, second by Mattson, to approve the minutes of the November 21, 2011 Council meetings as printed. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Motion by Tamke, second by Johnson, to approve the Treasurer's Report as printed. The year-to-date balance as of 11/30/2011 was \$18,583.23. Motion carried. Council unanimously agreed that Karen Wahl has provided a tremendous service to our church as Treasurer and we truly appreciate her dedication to overseeing important financial decisions of Zion. (Thanks, Karen!) Todd Vyskocil will be taking over Treasurer's duties as of January 1, 2012.

AGENDA: Motion by Johnson, second by Mattson, to approve the agenda with one addition to new business. Motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS:

Motion by Johnson, second by Reardon, to accept the Board Reports as given. Motion carried.

Trustees: Fresh air preventative maintenance will occur at LFOJ on 12/26/11 and two light fixtures have been repaired. All preventative maintenance has been completed for 2011.
