November 2015 Minutes: Motion to accept minutes by Tamke, second Guski. MMC.

Pastor's Report: Full schedule with academic studies, confirmation, sermon preparation, and worship services. Ordination/Installation was great, Pastor is so thankful for everyone's wishes and for those who helped out. Treasurer's Report: Weekly financial report in bulletin a good idea.
