Here is what it said, ⁴ He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." (Revelation 21:4).

So, because we are sinners, because there is death, we all at one time or another experience death, mourning, crying and pain. They are all part of living in this sinful and fallen world.

You might be saying at this point, thanks pastor for the cheerful news, and in this world, if that's all there was, you would be right. But thank good there is more. There is that verse of the day ⁴ He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away.". That is the good news, that even while we do experience those things far more regularly than we may want, they are only temporary, they are not all that there is, not even close. The verse proceeding our verse of the day really helps set the stage; ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people and God himself will be with them as their God. Think of that, when the crying, death, pain, and mourning of this world

have passed we will be with God! What does it say, "the dwelling place of God is with man" God wants to be with us! He wants us to be with him, He wants us to be his people, He wants to be our God! Just as it was in the beginning, God wants to be with His creation. And what will he do with us in His new creation? ⁴ He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." I look forward to those former things passing away, and because of God's promise of salvation for me through His Son's blessed death and resurrection, I can bear, for now, the death, the mourning, the crying, and the pain, because I know through faith in my Savior Jesus Christ, this too shall pass, "And I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever." (Psalm 23:6b)

derful time visiting family, visiting tourist attractions, just getting to spend some uninterrupted time together for those 10 days.


On a couple other quick items we are going to continue with Wednesday nights as online only for a

Esther's Story: The Book of Esther

Then Esther told them ... "I and my young women will also fast as you do. Then I will go to the king, though it is against the law, and if I perish, I perish" (Esther 4:15a, 16b).

Of the Word

Like a TV drama, Esther's story had a beauty contest, sinister plots, betrayal, and courage. Esther, a Judean, was taken captive by an edict of the king because he was looking for a replacement wife. From all the women in the king's harem, beautiful Esther was the one chosen. God had a plan for her!

An evil plot had been laid to destroy all the Jews of the kingdom. Esther, being a Jew, would not have escaped. After three days of praying and fasting she summoned the courage to go before the king unannounced, which could have resulted in her death. Esther was not turned away. 

A draft condemned the slave trade

In one of Jefferson's earlier drafts of the Declaration of Independence, he called slavery "a cruel war against human nature" and denounced King George III for "creating and sustaining" the slave trade. The language was deleted from the final version. Jefferson owned more than 200 slaves in 1776.



The first official celebration took place on July 4, 1777

The first official national celebration of America's independence was held in Philadelphia on July 4, 1777. John Adams did not attend in protest of the date. The year 1777 was also the year the American flag was officially established.

Here's why we set off fireworks

At the first national Independence Day Celebration in Philly in 1777, 13 cannons were fired, one round for each state of the union, bells were rung, and fireworks were set off, according to the Smithsonian, which says the 4th of July fireworks tradition grew from there.

About that "pursuit of happiness"...


Arguably the most famous line in the Declaration of Independence is the second sentence of the preamble, which begins, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed, by their Creator, with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." But as originally drafted by Thomas Jefferson, the pursuit was not of happiness, but of "Property." As the story goes, Benjamin Franklin convinced Jefferson to make the change because "property" was too "narrow" a notion.

John Adams wasn't happy about the choice of dates

On July 3, 1776, John Adams, who went on to become our second president, wrote a letter to his wife, Abigail, to tell her how excited he was that Congress had voted in favor of independence. "The Second Day of July 1776, will be the most memorable Epocha, in the History of America," he declared. Adams so firmly believed that July 2 was the correct day on which to celebrate American independence that he refused to appear at July 4th events as a matter of principle.

Plus our nation's constitution wasn't in place in any form until 1789

It wasn't until five years after our victory over the British in the Revolutionary War that the Articles of Confederation, the first version of what was to become the U.S. Constitution, was ratified by Congress. Since the Constitution is what actually defined our form of government and set boundaries on what our laws could and couldn't do, it's arguable that we weren't actually "born" as a country until 1789.






