"IN HIS TIME"

For my confirmation "examination" each member of our class was asked to write an essay that we would then present to the congregation on Confirmation Day. Some of the members of my family who were present that day told me how well I spoke, and that I ought to consider going into the pastoral ministry.

I was pleased to receive the compliments, but had never before that day considered becoming a pastor. After all, as far as I was concerned, I wasn't pastor "material." I wasn't! Believe me. At least not at that time. But in a few short months I was off to Concordia in Milwaukee [at that time a six-year school including four years of high school], all for the wrong reasons.

I started out well enough, but my grades spiraled downward from then on. I was more interested in having a good time than in my studies. After high school I was done with that and into the work force.

It was eight years later that God called me back. I felt like Moses who asked the Lord: "Who am I that I should go?" I had none of the qualities of pastoral material, except that I was involved in Bible study, and my faith in Christ had grown. The Lord led me to know it was time, and He blessed me with the gifts I needed to serve Him. He always does.

The point of all this is not to bore you with the details of my story, but to remind you that God's time is always best.

His timing and the direction of the Holy Spirit are what I will be praying for on Zion's behalf, and I would encourage you to do the same. As a Circuit Counselor I've seen congregations who have tried to speed up the process and have bypassed key steps in the calling process, and have created difficult situations.

Seek God's will; be open to the Spirit's guidance and direction; and wait for His time to carry out His plan for Zion Lutheran Church. May God bless your calling process!

Rev. Gene Wyssmann and I were in Joplin yesterday to meet with Rev. Greg Mech, Jeremy Schamber, Principal of Martin Lutheran School, Jason Glaskey (DCE) and several lay leaders of Immanuel Lutheran Church. They want to thank all who have responded with prayers, assistance, and words of encouragement. The challenges that they face are beyond words, but their faith in Almighty God is very evident.

Communication by phone and other technology is at best intermittent. This has made the task of accounting for the whereabouts and well-being of Immanuel members very difficult. Pastor Mech, Immanuel's staff and various lay leaders have made every effort to personally contact every member within the path of the tornado. They believe that they have accounted for every member that lived within the path of the storm. They are not aware of the death of any of their members even though many of their homes were totally destroyed. They have not been able to contact all of the school families.

14 members' homes or apartments were totally destroyed. Countless others sustained significant damage. The parsonage has major roof damage. The school building suffered roof damage, but temporary repairs have already been made. The church has no apparent damage, but is without electricity.

DCE Glaskey shared that the teenagers of the congregation, especially those that lost their homes, are experiencing significant emotional difficulties. Several have requested that he go with them and their family to the site of where their homes once stood to help them begin to deal with their loss.

Rev. William Doubek, pastor of First Lutheran Church, Neosho, has several members that sustained complete loss of their homes in Joplin. An eight year old girl and six year old boy from one of his families were killed by the tornado. The mother of these children is injured and hospitalized, as is her two year old child. Our prayers go out to this family.

As we were leaving the church, Red Cross staff was arriving to establish a command center at Immanuel. The challenge is that the church does not have large enough refrigerators and freezers to neither store food, nor proper space for other donations that are starting to arrive.

Rev. Glenn Merrick and Rev. Carlos Hernandez with Lutheran World Relief will visit Joplin today. Mr. Jim Eckrich and a number of other associates from Lutheran Disaster Relief will also be in Joplin today. Both organizations are giving the following advice:

I have requested Rev. Mech to send me a daily list of needs. Please check the Missouri District website for daily updates. One immediate need is the loan of John Deere Gators (or equivalent) to be used to move supplies through the disaster zone. The authorities will not permit delivery by car or truck. If you or a member of your congregation is willing to loan a Gator type vehicle, contact Karen Siegel, 314.317.4565. She will assist you with necessary delivery information.

THE CALL PROCESS

If you hadn't heard by now, Pastor Steckling is retiring, effective July 31st. Zion started the Call Process with a Pre-Call Meeting on May 11th with Pastor Hoelter. We will try to keep you informed as the process proceeds. At any time you have a question or comment please contact the office. The following are a few of the current topics.

VOTERS' MEETING – In order to move forward with the process to fill the future pastoral vacancy there will be a Voter's meeting following worship on June 5 to approve an "Enabling Motion" for the creation of a Call Committee. The motion recommended by the Council reads: "We, the congregation of Zion Lutheran Church, hereby vote to create a call committee, consisting of not more than 7 members, in order to prepare a call list and lead the process to fill our pastoral vacancy."

Call Committee

Are you interested in being on the Committee? What would you bring to this committee?

The committee will be selected (by the Church Council on June 6th) to represent a cross section of our Church members. There is a dedication of time and effort for this process. They could meet weekly for 1-3 months, then monthly (or as needed – more or less) until a Pastor has accepted a call. This process could take up to a year or longer. If you are interested, please submit you name, address, phone number, e-mail address, along with why you would be a good candidate, to the office (or in the "office secretary" mailbox in the Narthex) by June 1st.

There will be a couple other short-term committees that will need to assist in gathering and/or forming information. They will probably meet in June and have their tasks completed in 2-3 weeks.

REQUEST FOR NAMES OF PASTORAL CANDIDATES – Forms to nominate pastors to be on Zion's call list are available in the Narthex or ask in the office. Submit the completed form to the office secretary by June 5th. Please be sure to write clearly and thoroughly complete the forms.

MOWING SCHEDULE – It's spring and summer is around the corner. Along with the warmer temperatures and longer daylight hours comes about the summer outdoor chores, including lawn mowing. Please consider signing up to mow the lawn for the Church and around LFOJ. Sign up sheet in the narthex. Even two families at a time would be great.

May 16, 2011

The May 16, 2011 meeting of the Church Council was called to order by President, Nick Jarvela. Pastor Steckling opened the meeting with a devotion and prayer.

MINUTES: Motion by Wahl, second by Koosmann, to approve the minutes of the April 18, 2011 Council meeting as printed. Motion carried.

<u>TREASURER'S REPORT</u>: Motion by Johnson, second by Eyerly, to approve the Treasurer's Report as printed. The year-to-date balance as of 4/30/2011 was (\$74.25). Motion carried.

AGENDA: Motion by Johnson, second by Mattson, to approve the agenda with additions to New Business. Motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS:

Motion by Johnson, second by Mattson, to accept the Board Reports as given.

Elders: Met with confirmands in May for their final interviews – the elders were pleased with the responses of the confirmands. Twelve adults have expressed an interest in attending adult membership classes. Rick Williams is considering leading a class in the fall.

Trustees: Front steps will be repaired and improved soon. Continuing with preventative maintenance at the Church and LFOJ. Looking for funds needed to repair the Bell Tower.

Little Friends of Jesus: Bids to replace play area woodchips with better materials came to \$6,400 and \$6,900. The \$500 challenge grant was met and exceeded for a total donation of \$1,130.00 by members of Zion's congregation.

Evangelism: The church website is now active and live www.zionashland.org Lynn Ladd will communicate updates, changes or edits to the Webmaster. Evangelism is communicating with the memorial committee regarding ongoing projects.

Pastor: Four individuals were confirmed on May 15, 2011. See Official Acts for names. Pastor will be taking vacation on June 14-27 and July 8-14, prorated 3 weeks for seven months employment in 2011 (5 weeks normally).

Individuals wishing to serve on the call committee, or other committees associated with the efforts to secure a new pastor, are asked to submit their name and what they would bring to the process to the Church Secretary by June 1st, 2011, so that the Council can select members to represent a cross section of our Church membership.
- D. Council will meet on June 6th at 6:30 pm to select call committee members.
- E. A form to nominate pastors to be on our call list will be available in the Narthex. Forms should be completed and returned to the Church secretary (please be sure to write clearly and spell names correctly).
- F. Retirement Party: Anyone wishing to help plan Pastor's Retirement Party should contact Becky Sapper, 715/682-8867.
- G. Board of Education will work with Elders and Altar Guild to create a process for the flowers and cake for future Confirmation Sundays.

Motion by Warren, second by Reardon to approve the real estate transfer fees of \$30, to have all three of Zion's parcels combined into one parcel.

ADJOURN: Motion by Johnson, second by Warren to adjourn. Motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
