


SUNDAY SCHOOL SCOOP

Update on Debra Elmore-Nesheim

I love my job. I have begun working at the National Institutes of Health. The people I work with are awesome. We work with patients 0-21 years old or so, who have rare diseases and cancers. They come from all over the world to help with research for cures. And I only work 4 days a week, 10 hours each day. No weekends or holidays! We found a great LCMS church, too!

Now some news on my trip to Tanzania-

- OK! For one, I just mailed my VISA application yesterday. Luckily it just goes to the Tanzania Embassy in Washington, DC and takes only 5 days to process.
- It looks like a challenge for me is going to be finding a doctor in my new location. I have to start taking anti-malaria medication at least 3 weeks before leaving on my trip. That means I have to start this week.

Also, I got my flight schedule. When I was in WI, I was going to fly to Atlanta to meet up with the rest of the team and we'd fly to Tanzania from there. Now that I live here, I have to fly out of DC to Paris, transfer there and fly to Amsterdam before meeting up with the team! Yikes! I hear Paris is a crazy airport to get around in.

God is really at work in my life. Between this mission trip, my new job and where we live now I'm...awestruck. Seriously! That's about the only word I can think of to describe it. (Besides "blessed"). God is up to something!

After seeing the empty tomb, some ran and told others, some told no one, some saw angels, some were trembling, some were astonished, some were amazed, some were perplexed, some remembered Jesus' words, some believed, and others doubted. Imagine the confusion, the terror, the joy, the fear...this was no ordinary day... no ordinary event.... no ordinary sight... For this was God at God's best. Turning everything upside down. Transforming ordinary into extraordinary. Transforming awful in awe-full. Transforming amazing into amazing grace. Transforming grief into joy. Transforming doubt into faith. Transforming sin into righteousness. Transforming despair into hope. Transforming earthly into divine. Transforming time into eternity. Nothing was half-baked. The stone was rolled away. The tomb was empty. The grave clothes were shed. It was "the resurrection from the dead." Jesus is Alive! He is Risen! Alleluia.

I believe multiple empty tomb accounts are recorded for we best see ourselves in the response of the disciples: trembling, confused, fearful, doubting... For it is the Resurrection of Jesus Christ that moves the stones and sets us free to speak words of divine awe, that tunes our vision to the eternal, that equips our hands to serve others, and energizes our feet to run with the Good News of Redemption.
