
NEED A PRAYER?

We have a good outline of what needs to be done and help is available. Please contact the Pastor or office if you could help us out this summer. We would like to have this filled by the end of May.

Our grandson in Mumbai learned at his preschool: Sharing is Caring.

The Sharanam Center is a permanent home in Mumbai, India, for girls who were formerly destitute, neglected or abandoned. This center is located in Dharavi Slum and supports thirty-six girls and young women. I was introduced to this center through my daughter-in-law, Roya, and decided to volunteer there the fall of 2014. The girls want to improve their English to support their education; so five days a week I tutored Mary, Maria, and Sabera to help them prepare for grade level exams.



We read stories and answered questions, we wrote stories about real life scenarios, we wrote folk tales, we shared our own stories, and we laughed and worked together. These girls would greet me each day with enthusiastic joy and end our sessions with expressions of gratitude; it was easy to love Mary, Maria, Sabera, and all their sisters. When I mentioned my return to India and shared information about the Center with the Evangelism Committee, Lisa Sunie and JoAnne Honkala offered to organize Zion's high school youth group to donate stickers and colored pens to the Center; the girls love stickers and pens. The Zion youth group would also write notes to the girls. Zion was eager to send a message to India: Sharing is caring.

A few days before we left, I tucked these precious stickers, pens, and notes into our suitcase. Although I could not volunteer at the Center this time, I made arrangements



to visit the girls and bring the Zion gifts. The day before I was inspired to bake two loaves of banana bread for the girls and order a chocolate cake that said: *Greetings with Love*. Herb also wanted to visit the Center and meet everyone.

So the driver brought us to Matunga Labor Campneighborhood where the center is.

We entered the four story no-frills concrete building and navigated the dark hallway to find the "old cage" elevator in the back corner. We took the creaky elevator to the 3rd floor, and then had to walk up one set of stairs to the fourth level. The girls could hear us coming and were so excited... laughing and shouting words of welcome. They even helped Herb up the uneven steps. Once we arrived inside the center's secure entrance, hellos and hugs were plentiful. After introductions, we gave out



the stickers; the girls were thrilled. I gave the colored pens to the house mother (Sharda) to be shared as needed. The girls also took turns reading the notes; they love to read English. Then it was time to cut the cake (chocolate is always a hit) and eat banana bread... a first for them. A bonus treat was to see Ananda, the center cook. She was very sick in 2014 with breast cancer treatment; now she has a full head of curly hair and wears an amazing smile of recovery.

Before we knew it, it was time to go. Some girls also had to leave. Each girl has a daily schedule to include: school, sports, exercise, travel, dance, camp, shopping; the Sharanam Center is family. In fact, the Center recently celebrated their first two college graduates.

If and when you have the opportunity to travel to Mumbai, you will want to visit the Sharanam Center and meet these special friends. Each girl has a story of hope and the Sharanam Center opens doors to make this happen. Sharanam leans on volunteers visiting Mumbai to help these girls identify their talents, fine-tune their skills, and achieve their dreams. You might even offer to volunteer. May God bless and keep our young people at Zion, and the staff and beautiful sisters at Sharanam Center. Thank you, Zion youth, for sending the message: **Sharing is Caring.** Alice Ellis
