Well, I am not seeing a lot of May flowers, the temperature has been yoyoing all over the place, I was able to golf this morning and it was 54 degrees, tomorrow they are forecasting 1-2 inches of snow. Patience is the key. Patience is the key! How true a statement is that. Seems I have been hearing people speak of patience all my life. When I was a child, patience, your birthday will come, patience, it's almost Christmas, patience, school is almost over for the year. And I have discovered as I get older, that never changes. For most of my life I considered myself a patient person. I could wait, as long as there was something to wait for. As an adult, when I started raising a family, working, serving in the military, patience was very important. I always took pride when people would tell me "you have the patience of a saint". You know, I was never quite sure what that meant, what saint? I always assumed that was a good thing. Now as I am reaching the later years of my life, it seems my patience tank is running a little low. Ask my wife, she will, I am afraid, will attest to that, my tolerance for things that require patience is not what it used to be. And now after years of me telling her to "relax" I find her telling me to "be patient". As I said, this is something new to me, in my defense I tell her that I don't need to be patient, but perhaps people need to be a little less trying. So, as I considered my newly developing lack of patience, I decided I had better turn to the one place where I know I can find the answer to my dilemma. The Word of God. A concordance search on the word patience in the ESV Bible reveals some very interesting things. First, I found that the word patience is used 22 times in scripture and of those 22 times only once in the Old Testament. That O.T. reference comes as you might imagine from the book of Proverbs 25:14-16 ¹⁴ Like clouds and wind without rain is a man who boasts of a gift he does not give. ¹⁵ With patience a ruler may be persuaded, and a soft tongue will break a bone. ¹⁶ If you have found honey, eat only enough for you, lest you have your fill of it and vomit it.

So, it appears in this Old Testament reference we are to use patience to help influence those around us, particularly those who may be in charge. I have to admit, I have seen this work many times in my life. But what about the New Testament? What does it have to say? Well, I am going to generalize greatly here, and I believe deeper research would bear me out. There are primarily two uses of patience in the New Testament. The first is in reference to God's patience in dealing with us. We are all sinners, and we do not always respond as quickly and completely as we should to God's gift of salvation, in our human nature we can be quite stubborn and what is one way that you can win over a stubborn person? Wait them out, with patience. A couple of examples of God's patience are as follows:

Romans 9:22-23; ²² What if God, desiring to show his wrath and to make known his power, has endured with much patience vessels of wrath prepared for destruction, ²³ in order to make known the riches of his glory for vessels of mercy, which he has prepared beforehand for glory—

1 Peter 3:20; ²⁰ because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water.

2 Peter 3:15a; ¹⁵ And count the patience of our Lord as salvation,

The Lord was patient from the fall of mankind in Eden until the birth of Christ in Bethlehem, and continues to be patient with us to this day as we await the return of Christ and our resurrection. Virtually all of the other references to patience in the New Testament are in regard to how we are live our lives in patients. A few of those examples are:

James 5:7; Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains.

Colossians 3:13; Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience,

Galatians 5:22; But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

Luke 8:15; As for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bear fruit with patience

My friends, when life and this world grabs a hold of you, when you feel as if your patience is at an end, call on the Lord, He is of His very essence patient, lift up your voice to Him in prayer. When you think that last nerve is about to go, when that last straw is heading toward the camel's back, remember how patient our Lord is with you, through thick and thin, through good and bad, through up and down, he is with you always. We have His promise, He will never leave us or forsake us. Count on Him, particularly when you are trying to count to ten.

Have an enjoyable May, endure the changing weather with patience, and I hope to see you all soon and I close with some more patience words from the Apostle Paul.

I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. Ephesians 4:1-3

The **National Day of Prayer** is an annual day of observance held on the first Thursday of May, designated by the United States Congress, when people are asked "to turn to God in prayer and meditation". The president is required by law (36 U.S.C. § 119) to sign a proclamation each year, encouraging all Americans to pray on this day. [1][2]

The modern law formalizing its annual observance was enacted in 1952, although earlier days of fasting and prayer had been established by the Second Continental Congress from 1775 until 1783, and by President John Adams in 1798 and 1799. [3] Thomas Jefferson established a day of prayer and thanksgiving, but this occurred while he served as governor of Virginia. [5]

The constitutionality of the National Day of Prayer was unsuccessfully challenged in court by the Freedom From Religion Foundation after their attempt was unanimously dismissed by a panel of a federal appellate court in April 2011. [6][7]



The alternative name of "Memorial Day" was first used in 1882, but did not become more common until after World War II, and was not declared the official name by Federal law until 1967. On June 28, 1968, the United States Congress passed the Uniform Holidays Bill, which moved four holidays from their traditional dates to a specified Monday in order to create a convenient three-day weekend. The holidays included Washington's Birthday (which evolved into Presidents' Day), Columbus Day, Veterans Day, and Memorial Day. The change moved Memorial Day from its traditional May 30 date to the last Monday in May. The law took effect at the federal level in 1971. After some initial confusion and unwillingness to comply at the state level, all fifty states adopted the measure within a few years, although Veterans Day was eventually changed back to its traditional date. Ironically, most corporate businesses no longer close on Columbus Day or Veterans Day, and an increasing number are staying open on President's Day as well.




