Zion Lutheran Church Council Minutes October 15, 2012

The October 15, 2012 meeting of the Church Council was called to order by President, Chuck Chronis who opened the meeting with a devotion and prayer.

ROLL CALL: President – Chuck Chronis, Trustee – Jim Johnson, Financial Secretary – Mary Koosmann, Secretary – Becky Sapper, Evangelism – Lori Hebert, Stewardship – Penny Mattson, Education - Lynn Ladd, LFOJ - Cheri Tamke, Elder - Darryl Warren and church member Herb Ellis.

MINUTES: Motion by Johnson, second by Koosmann, to approve the minutes of the September 17, 2012 Council meeting as printed. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Motion by Warren, second by Hebert, to approve the Treasurer's Report through September 2012 as written. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Motion by Johnson, second by Hebert, to approve the agenda with additions to new business. Motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS:

Motion by Tamke, second by Hebert, to accept the Board reports as given. Motion carried.

Elders – Confirmation is going well, no 6th graders – only 7th and 8th graders this year. Rick is providing guidance on catechism on each Wednesday evening. Elders and Evangelism may be getting together to discuss potential ideas and activities.

Trustees –Basement entrance to LFOJ was improved by replacing retaining walls, removing soil encroachment and providing swales for water diversion. The LFOJ sump pump discharge was moved to west side of building to get allow it to get further away from the building. Lawn mowers were winterized, dehumidifiers cleaned and stored and carpet secured on west entrance area.

Education – Superintendent's position is still vacant. Thirty-four children are enrolled in Sunday School. Christmas program will be held on December 23, 2012. Children are being requested to turn in "children mite boxes" monthly to support the work of LWML.

LFOJ – newsletter will no longer be included in the church newsletter since it is a month behind. Updates will be provided in an "LFOJ Happenings" section. A used refrigerator, stove and microwave in good condition were donated to the center. A donation of \$150 was received and given to Zion to offset the costs from the June flood. A new evacuation crib was purchased through a Youngstar Grant. **Evangelism** –Freewill offering envelopes raised more than \$500 which will be used to support college students. Jim Johnson will be joining the Evangelism committee and working on a Bible study outreach project called "Share Jesus without Fear".

There were no official acts or old business to discuss.

NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Motion by Tamke, second by Koosman to have a free will offering on November 11 to support the BRICK, with inserts placed in the November 4 bulletin as requested by BRICK volunteer and Zion church member Herb Ellis. Motion carried.
- B. Discussion regarding the mortgage was tabled until the November Council meeting.
- C. No changes will be made to the current insurance carrier; information shows we are getting good rates and coverage.
- D. Trustees will move the wiring of the bell from the LFOJ office to a more logical location and new locks will be installed on the LFOJ office doors.
- E. President Chuck Chronis appointed Jim Johnson, Mike Cashman and Jule Jarvela to the nominating committee.

Call committee continues to meet and work with Pastor Bo. A Voters' meeting is anticipated for Nov 11, 2012.

ADJOURN: Motion by Johnson, second by Tamke to adjourn. Motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
