November, hardly seems possible. The big three holidays rapidly approach-Wow. ing.....Thanksgiving, Christmas, and hunting season. We even get to set our clocks back an hour this Sunday. All signs that our year is almost over. Well not only is our calendar year almost over but our church year will be ending even sooner. November 24th is the last Sunday in Pentecost and by the time you get the next newsletter we will be starting the new church year with Advent. There are three Wednesdays in Advent this year and for those three Wednesdays as well as Christmas Eve and Christmas we will be doing a special series called "Unto us a Child is Born". In this series we are going to look at the names of the Messiah referenced by Isaiah 9:1-7. The names of the Messiah found there: Great Light, Wonderful Counselor, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace, and One of Us. Along with the messages related to those names we will be singing a number of favorite Christmas hymns. So please join us on Wednesday nights at 6:30 starting December 4th. Also just a reminder you don't have to wait until December 4th to join us on Wednesday night, we are still having regular Wednesday night sessions as well. Next week will be the final message in our 6 parts series on Joseph. Wednesday night services are a completely separate service from Sunday on a slightly more informal setting, please come and check it out.

I wanted to thank everyone for all their prayers, thoughts, and kind words before, during, and after my shoulder surgery. Thank the Lord the surgery went well and the healing process is going well and the pain I do have has been very manageable. I am a little tired of the sling already, but I am told that is quite common.

I wanted to take just a moment and share two acronyms with you, the first we heard a couple weeks ago, P.U.S.H. Pray Until Something Happens, I have been reminded of this so many times since that sermon message, when I leave the gas station, when I see a friend who heard the message, on the door of my hospital room. Such a powerful message, remind each other always. The other acronym is a new one I learned this week in my classes, S.O.A.P., it stands for Scripture, Observation, Application. Prayer. So in other words, S-Scripture, read a passage of scripture, take your time don't rush. O-Observation, pick out a particular verse or verses that stick out to you and then paraphrase it in your own words. Then for the A-Application personalize it by asking how it applies in your life right now. Perhaps it is instruction, encouragement, revelation of a new promise, or correction for a particular area of your life. And then P-Pray, come before the Lord in prayer, it can be as simple as asking God to help you use this scripture, or it may be a greater insight on what He may be revealing to you. REMEMBER, prayer is a two-way conversation, so be sure to listen to what God has to say! For the next couple weeks we are going to be looking at how to use the S.O.A.P. method for personal Bible Study and Prayer growth in our Sunday morning Bible study. Pick some of your favorite scriptures and bring them with. The other nice thing about this method is it works equally as well or perhaps even better on unfamiliar scripture. So please come and join us.

So until next month, the Lord Bless you and keep you, the Lord make His face shine upon you and gracious unto you, the Lord give you Peace. Amen Vicar Rick

The October 21, 2013 meeting of the Church Council was called to order by President, Chuck Chronis Vicar Williams opened the meeting with prayer.

ROLL CALL: Chuck Chronis (President), Darryl Warren (Elder), Lynn Ladd (Education), Todd Vyskocil (Treasurer), Mary Koosmann (Financial Secretary), Penny Mattson (Stewardship), Becky Sapper (Secretary), Lori Hebert (Evangelism), Rick Williams (Vicar).

MINUTES: Motion by Mattson, second by Warren, to approve the minutes of the September 16, 2013 Council meeting with addition of Mary Koosmann (Financial Secretary) added to the Roll Call and the remaining minutes as printed. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Motion by Ladd, second by Hebert, to approve the Treasurer's Report as printed. As of September 30, 2013 Zion had \$75,711.12 in assets and \$21,534.29 in liabilities. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Motion by Warren, second by Hebert, to approve the agenda as printed with additions to new business. Motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS: Motion by Warren, second by Mattson to accept the Board Reports as given. Motion carried.

Vicar's Report: Vicar Williams has had several trips to Duluth and MMC this last month for visitations. Two funerals and one baptism were conducted. Attended Pastor's conference and AAMA a local preacher circuit and Vicar Williams joined the schedule for preaching at area nursing homes every 8-12 weeks. 3 ½ weeks remain of the first semester of schooling for Vicar Williams. LFOJ will be recognized on Reformation Sunday. Wednesday services are continuing to go well.

Evangelism: creating care packages for Zion's college students to help them prepare for finals and flu season.

OLD BUSINESS:

Nomination Committee for new board members consists of Brenda Schwiesow, Sandy Frisco and Doug Warren. The following positions are up for election: Council Secretary, Board of Elders (1), Board of Education (2), Evangelism Board (1), Board of Trustees (2), Stewardship Board (1), LFOJ (1).

Ladd found a policy regarding Sexual Harassment /Abuse last updated June 16, 2003. This policy may meet the needs that were requested by Guide One Insurance which would lower the insurance premium. The policy will be shared with trustees with the following additions made to section V.E. to read: Two adults will be in attendance at all youth functions with at least one adult with 6 months experience volunteering with youth as a member of Zion or with an established relationship with Zion, for example Camp Luther counselors. Motion made by Warren, second by Hebert to accept amendments to this policy with approval from trustees. Motion carried.

Adjacent properties to Zion are for sale, but there is not a current need for Zion to make a purchase. If a member is interested in purchasing the properties, Zion would like be considered for the Right for First Refusal if the property were to be sold in the future when needs of the church may be different. All agreed it would be beneficial in the long term for the property to be owned by the church or by a church member but it currently does not meet the need for a Zion investment.

NEW BUSINESS:

The BRICK has made a request for an annual giving offering for November 17, 2013. Motion by Warren, second by Koosmann to increase our monthly giving to the BRICK from \$135 to \$270 for November instead of placing a basket for free will offering. A notice will be placed in the bulletin and newsletter letting members know that if they wish to assist the BRICK with their annual giving offering that they can place it in the offering plate on November 17, 2013 with it clearly marked as a donation for the BRICK. Motion carried.

Individuals with Thrivent investments should take the opportunity prior to March to allocate their Thrivent Choice dollars. Both Zion and LFOJ are options for Thrivent Choice dollars. Allocations can be done on-line or in person at the Thrivent office in Ashland.

ADJOURN: Motion by Warren, second by Sapper to adjourn. Motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
