Hundreds Hospitalized After New Hymn Introduced in Church

Huron, SD – Hundreds were hospitalized and scores more traumatized for life in the wake of a disastrous hymn roll-out this past Sunday.

Recklessly acting in a way contrary to all Lutheran sensibilities, Pastor Norman Schroeder inserted a previously unsung hymn, "Through Jesus' Blood and Merit," into the church service.

"I remember paging to hymn 372 and thinking that it looked unfamiliar," said helpless victim Delores Hamilton from her hospital bed. "My heart started pounding in my chest! My vision narrowed! As we started singing

my hands trembled uncontrollably. I felt lightheaded! I don't even think I made it through the first stanza before I passed out."

First responders were overwhelmed by the chaotic scene. Ambulances struggled to make their way through the terrified mob streaming through the church parking lot. Inside the sanctuary, hundreds were incapacitated, many still frozen with their hands clutched over their ears in a vain attempt to shut out the unfamiliar tune. The few conscious congregants were in such a weakened state they were unable to assist their more gravely injured Lutherans.

"We haven't seen such a tragedy since the Reformed Church tried to introduce a contemporary version of the Song of Simeon," lamented local Police Chief Richard Johnson. "Thank goodness there was no loss of life. If we hadn't tasered the organist, the death toll would have been truly catastrophic."

The investigation is only beginning, but already red warning lights are flashing in the eyes of any common sense Lutheran. Why didn't Pastor Schroeder run his plans through the worship committee? Why wasn't the hymn tune introduced as postlude, prelude, and offertory? Why weren't congregants warned the standard three months in advance that a new hymn was being introduced?

Only a fair, impartial investigation and the immediate excommunication of Pastor Schroeder can ensure such a tragedy never occurs again.

Below are some of the comments of this article:

I have worked with head trauma, stroke and Alzheimer patients etc.....Those old familiar simple hymns made their eyes light up and gave them a touch with memories again....They knew them well and sang with gusto....but their own names they couldn't rememberMany people in church are dealing with hurts, sicknesses, etc. ...familiar hymns help them heal, give them renewed strength to face their heartaches, pains and problems... they can go home and make it thru another week..... Many joyful songs lift their hearts especially Christmas carols, etc.....With the startling increase in Alzheimer's population....think we need all the music therapy we can get... It is easy to poke fun until you have walked in another person's shoes....

Reminds me of an old joke.

Every person is God's unique creation. Every life has a purpose. What joy we find in discovering our God-given gifts and following His lead in using them to serve others!


Walking with My Lord

Herb and I used the time to do some shopping in Duluth.

What caught my eye was how so many stores are already setting up "shop" for the Christmas season. The music is playing, candy canes greet you at the door, evergreen scents the air, and many store elves are stocking shelves with toys, chocolate, ornaments and so much more. Seems a little early... well, maybe!

Many times we see all this stuff and we say "only in America." 4. What Baptism Indicates

Fourth

What does such baptizing with water indicate? It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

Where is this written?

St. Paul writes in Romans chapter six: "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life" [Rom. 6:4].

What is the Old Adam?

The Old Adam is the corrupt and evil nature that we inherit because of Adam's fall into sin. **Eph. 4:22** Put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according

to the deceitful lusts (NKJV).

How is this Old Adam to be drowned in us?

The Old Adam is to be drowned by daily contrition (sorrow for sins) and repentance (faith), by which we resist and overcome evil desires. **Luke 9:23** If anyone would come after Me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow Me.

Gal. 5:24 Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the sinful nature with its passions and desires.

What is the new man?

The new man is the new spiritual life and nature, created in us by the washing of rebirth. **2 Cor. 5:17** If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation.

How is this new man to emerge and arise?

The new man emerges and arises as we daily live and grow before God in true faith and good works.

Eph. 4:24 Put on the new man which was cre-

An Explanation of The Small Catechism How does Baptism indicate the daily drowning of the Old Adam and the emergence of the new man? By Baptism we have been made to share in Christ's death and resurrection. As He has buried our sin, so we too can and must daily overcome and bury it. And as He is risen from the dead and lives, so we too can and must daily live a new life in Him.

Rom. 6:3-4 Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

With which words do we regularly remember our Baptism?

The words "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" come from the baptismal command (Matt. 28:19) and are known as the Trinitarian Invocation. By repeating these words, in church or by ourselves, we recall, claim, and confess before heaven, earth, and hell all that God the Holy Trinity has given us in our Baptism.

Rom. 8:38-39 1 am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Bible narrative: The three persons of the blessed Trinity revealed themselves at the Baptism of our Lord (Lu.ke 3:21-22).

Note: The Trinitarian Invocation may be accompanied by the sign of the cross, made at our Baptism upon our foreheads and hearts to mark us as "redeemed by Christ the crucified."

A Short Form for Holy Baptism in Cases of Emergency

In urgent cases, in the absence of a pastor, any Christian may administer Holy Baptism. Take water, call the person by name, and apply the water, saying: "I baptize you in the name of the Father


