

Zion Lutheran Church Special Voters Meeting

August 21, 2011

The August 21, 2011 Special Voters Meeting of the members of Zion Church was called to order by President Nick Jarvela. Thirty-seven (37) members were in attendance.

President Nick Jarvela explained the purpose of the meeting was to hire a pulpit pastor to help fulfill some of Zion's needs until a new pastor was called.

Pastor Hyvonen is available to preach on Sundays (and Wednesday advent services, if necessary), lead adult bible studies on Monday mornings and Sunday after church, attend to funerals and weddings as needed, visit shut-ins and those in the hospital and have office hours for administrative needs on a weekly basis.

Motion by Francis Graves, second by June Williams, to hire Pastor Hyvonen with a salary consisting of 50% of the base pastoral pay and including mileage reimbursement from Bessemer at 55 cents per mile for the above mentioned duties. Motion carried.

Zion Lutheran Church Special Voters Meeting

September 19, 2011

The September 19, 2011 Special Voters Meeting of the members of Zion Church was called to order by Elder, Darryl Warren. District Counselor, Pastor Baumeister, opened the meeting with a devotion and prayer. Thirty-six (36) members were in attendance.

Pastor Baumeister outlined the next steps in the call process. Discussion on the candidates brought forth to the congregation by the call committee, vote for a candidate or rejection of both, request for a unanimous vote to call the candidate who received the majority vote.

Information on two candidates who had done phone interviews with the call committee was provided to the attendees. Rick Williams, chair of the call committee, led the discussion of the two candidates which were brought forth and reasoning behind their recommendation of Pastor Harste. Attendees asked a number of questions based on the information provided.

A ballot vote was taken and Pastor Harste received the majority vote (26) and Pastor Smiles received 10 votes. A request to have a unanimous vote was made by Elder Darryl Warren. Motion did not pass with one nay. After discussion with Pastor Baumeister and clarification from Pastor Harste the issue was satisfied. Motion by Ken Philaja, second by June Williams for the unanimous vote to call Pastor Harste. Motion carried unanimously.

Pastor Baumeister called Pastor Harste to present the call to him. Pastor Harste was overjoyed and said he would consider the call. The call committee will send the necessary paperwork to Pastor Harste by Thursday and he has a two week time frame to respond to Zion's call.

Call Committee Update: Pastor Harste and his wife, Joanne, are planning on visiting Zion and the Ashland area Sept. 30th - Oct. 2nd.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Motion by Johnson, second by Koosmann, to approve the Treasurer's Report as printed. The year-to-date balance as of 8/31/2011 was \$7,413.48. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Motion by Johnson, second by Mattson, to approve the agenda with additions to New Business. Motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS:

Motion by Wahl, second by Koosmann, to accept the Board Reports as given.

Trustees: Cleaned, sanded and stained LFOJ deck, Parking stripes were painted on LFOJ lot; preventative maintenance as necessary at Church and LFOJ.

Education: Nineteen 6th-8th grade students and 12-15 younger students currently attending Sunday School.

Pastor: Pastor has been meeting with shut-ins, providing chapel service to LFOJ, Bible studies, opening confirmation classes. He would like to begin Adult Instruction for new members very soon. LWML Rally Sunday will be October 2nd. Pastor Hyvonen has prior obligations for October 16, 30 and Nov 6th. He will be preaching on September 25, October 2, 9, 23, November 13 and each Sunday following this date until his services are no longer needed.

Our Bible curriculum for this year is *Noah's Park*. We'll be hearing Bible stories from both the old and new testament. For September, our Jesus time will focus on how God gave us the church.
