IT HAS BEEN ORDERED! The congregation voted on September 14th to purchase a digital Allen L1-22 organ. The benefits are numerous: good sound, reliable, does not need to be tuned, not frequent repairs, built in USA. The total cost is \$38,710 to be paid in three installments: first payment upon order, second when delivered, third when installed. The estimated time from the order to installation is 3 to 4 months, with an estimated time of arrival in late January, early February. There is enough money in Zion's Memorial Fund for the first installment. What a Difference a Day Makes

Today is a fresh fall-like day, cool wind, jacket temps, and shifting signs of the season. For yesterday gale-force winds blew in with a roar and swept away much of summer. Our local beaches were erased with crashing waves, seagulls were ruffled, patio chairs overturned, branches broken, corn stalks tangled, sunflowers cut down, spent flowers stripped, milkweed matted, screen tents collapsed, docks splintered, boats swamped...and all we had left were memories of life before the storm, and a fresh heap of debris on our lakeshore. Where did the lemonade comfort of summer go? Folks, this is life upnorth. Where each season has its own beauty-and-beast drama, and nature drives the calendar forward.

On-going change has always defined the stories of God's people. Abraham was called to pull up stakes and set out for a new landscape. The benefits are numerous: good sound, reliable, does not need to be tuned, not frequent repairs, built in USA. The total cost is \$38,710 to be paid in three installments: first payment upon order, second when delivered, third when installed. The estimated time from the order to installation is 4 to 5 months. Pastor Bahn noted there is enough money in Zion's Memorial Fund for the first installment. He encouraged the congregation to give "special gifts" to honor a loved one, celebrate an anniversary, etc. The committee will place special organ offering envelops in the pews.

MMC by Scott Thimm to order the Allen organ. Second by Nick Jarvela. Member vote unanimous.

MMC by Becky Sapper to list Zion's pipe organ for sale. Second by June Williams. Member vote unanimous.

Capital Improvements:

Todd Vyskosil reported on an opportunity to increase our loan and borrow \$90,000 more from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) for boiler replacement and roof repair. Nick Jarvela, Trustee, joined Todd to explain the two bids on the boiler. There is even the possibility of a rebate from the state when a more efficient system is installed. They hope to get the new boiler installed this fall.

MMC by John Pruss to add \$90,000 to our present balance with LCEF for the purchase of a new boiler and roof replacements. Second by Fran Kuester. Member vote unanimous.

Circuit Visitor:

Pastor Bahn volunteered to represent Zion at the Circuit meeting. John Pruss volunteered to be a lay representative if his work schedule makes it possible to attend the meeting. MMC by Nick Jarvela to accept Pastor Bahn and John Pruss to represent Zion. Second by Ron Schwiesow. Member vote unanimous.

MMC by Ethel Guss to adjourn the meeting. Second by Fran Kuester. Member vote unanimous. The meeting was closed with The Lord's Prayer.
