Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Where does one begin? First let us give thanks to God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit for the years of service to Zion and the surrounding communities that were given by Pastor and Mary Steckling. God only knows entirely what the fruits of their labor will be. We do know that Pastor Steckling administered God's Word and sacraments faithfully, with great care and love. I was a teacher and coach in Mellen for six years and I was a Program Coordinator and teacher for the Ironwood Community Schools program before leaving for the seminary. After graduation and ordination I served at Immanuel Mohican Ev. Lutheran Church near Gresham, WI and was the Missionary at Large to Native Americans for the North Wisconsin District. I accepted a dual parish call to Immanuel, Cecil and Zion, Zachow. These three towns are near Shawano, WI, about forty miles north west of Green Bay. Diane was an X-ray Technician and worked for a few years in Ashland. She now works out of the home as a Medical Transcriptionist.

Vacancies are always awkward to say the least, but I am looking forward to serving the congregation of Zion. I have been so very blessed to know that there are great leaders and staff members at Zion. I have met a number of you already and am looking forward to meeting and getting to know many more. The call process is moving forward and I will be in contact with Pastor Baumeister on a regular basis. Because of prior commitments, preaching at other congregations, I will not be able to serve some Sundays at Zion. I have begun visiting the shut-in members and will see them at least once per month. I have led chapel services and will continue monthly. I will be leading Bible Studies beginning in September and will help as time allows with the junior catechism classes. Thanks to all who have helped me thus far, you know who you are!



Behold the Sunflower

When I look at my sunflowers, it is hard to believe these mega-plants began from a small seed sown in June. What kind of energy is packaged in such a device that within two months a 5 to 6 ft. green-structure is lifted up with a wood-fiber stalk supporting a large bright sun-yellow flower?

Sunflowers are not new to America. In fact, history indicates they have been here for thousands of years, and the products of sunflowers have made them part of the human story for centuries. I guess you would say my relationship with sunflowers is rather self-serving as I enjoy their majesty and beauty. For even before dawn they stand at attention with their bright dish-faces postured to catch the first rays of daybreak. As the day progresses, motor cells shift the flowers to track the sun to receive the full light until the setting sun. During this process, bumble bees cling to the flower-heads to feed on the nectar and set in motion the pollination and formation of seeds. Soon the flowers become weighty seed-heads —a magnet for hungry birds. Even though the drooped heads no longer lift to track the sun, the faithful light completes the ripening process. The sun-flower relationship is a dynamic partnership and I marvel how this God-designed ecosystem blesses

In the *Book of Matthew* the kingdom of God is compared to a small seed of faith that grows up into a large tree with many branches to offer shelter to birds. To me, sunflowers echo the spiritual energy of sowing one tiny seed of faith that becomes a structure of countless God-opportunities. For God is eager for us to turn toward him at dawn, to follow Him in the heat of the day, and rest in His light when we bed down at night. He is our ever-ready sunshine... eager to stir vigorous growth that we may partner with Him to bless others. What a gift to observe sunflowers and other creative expressions of His presence that help us remember to "turn our eyes upon Jesus and look full in His wonderful face." Be lifted up and Behold the Son of God!

artREACH Mission Update

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Here in Bayfield, WI it's a little cooler these days. Our apples are turning red and the sailboats are out on Lake Superior. Over the past 1-1/2 years we've been taking things slowly as we build relationships in our small community and prepare for the work God will have us do. There are some updates for you, though!

On Debra's last Scalpel at the Cross mission trip (Scalpel at the Cross is an orthopedic medical mission to the people of Peru) she was asked to paint the organization's mission statement on the fellowship hall wall. While the rest of the team was in clinic, she stayed back to paint. It was then that God gave her an idea for a subdivision of artREACH – a graphic design mission! After all, how many churches, missions and individuals have no access to a graphic designer? So, Apostle Graphics was born. Before there was time to set up a website to announce Apostle Graphics, God brought us our first account! Still lacking in an Apostle Graphics website, we are now on our fifth account. God is good and has given us another vision for serving others.

In addition, Steven is developing an arts-driven program called Art Tracks. He's been working with someone from the Bayfield area to get local artists involved with arts education for children. The program is being built to create relationships within the community and build confidence in children while teaching them arts basics. The first intended audience is the children of the Red Cliff Indian Reservation. However, Steven has been asked to teach classes out of an art gallery in Washburn, WI, so he's hoping to use the program starting there in November.

We recently received an affirmation from the Lord as to why we are in Bayfield! Three years ago, we weren't even considering moving from the Twin Cities, but we did have a dream of an artREACH space for artists to create art and enrich their faith. Through a series of events, God led us to Bayfield and, by no volition of our own, we were blessed with 10 beautiful acres of land. There's much more to the story, but we believe God brought us here to build a retreat center!

We have just started sharing this dream with our area Christian brothers and sisters, and one woman shared our vision for artREACH and the retreat center with her mission group – a chapter of the Christian Motorcyclists Association. Without our knowledge, the group voted unanimously to come to our property and pray over it! So, on July 30th, we had a potluck with 20 people (many motorcyclists in full gear) sitting under our pine trees praying for us, artREACH and the retreat center. It was an amazingly inspired experience. We have no idea how this retreat center will be funded, but so far God has provided us with the idea, the land, a floor plan and a small group of workers. We have faith that this idea is bigger than we imagine, and God can pull it off!

Also, we are preparing for our first artREACH annual retreat. It will be held on Friday and Saturday, October 21 & 22, at St. Michael's Church. During the retreat, we'll discuss evangelism to and through artists, we'll work on building the infrastructure of the artREACH team and we'll work on evangelistic project development. The cost is nothing, with a voluntary donation of \$20. Friday evening we'll dine out together, but pay separately. Breakfast and lunch will be catered on Saturday. If you are an artist or someone with a heart for artists, you are welcome to attend. Registration is required. You can see God is active in the artREACH ministry! We're excited to see where He takes us. We ask for your prayers and support as we wait patiently on Him and move forward with His plan for us.

MINUTES: Motion by Johnson, second by Warren, to approve the minutes of the May 16, 2011 and the June 6, 2011 Council meetings as printed. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Motion by Warren, second by Mattson, to approve the Treasurer's Report as printed. The year-to-date balance as of 7/31/2011 was \$2,190.06. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Motion by Warren, second by Mattson, to approve the agenda with additions to New Business. Motion carried.

BOARD REPORTS:

Motion by Warren, second by Tamke, to accept the Board Reports as given.

Elders: Recent activity has focused on Pastoral vacancy. Rick Williams will carry out pulpit duties as needed.

Trustees: Replaced sump pump; repaired concrete front entrance; completed maintenance needs at LFOJ. Trustees are researching the possibility of moving the bell tower to above the chapel and paving a smooth front entrance to the church.

Little Friends of Jesus: New rating and County reimbursement system for daycares is taking affect. This is helping to increase numbers based on the fact some home day cares are not participating. Still looking to increase preschool numbers for this fall.


NEW BUSINESS:

Ashland School District

Can you believe that the summer is almost over. School supplies are already on sale, which is a sign that the summer is ending and the start of the school year is right around the corner. With that being said, here is some information that you may find helpful to you as you plan your schedule for the Week of August 29—September 2.

*Thursday, September 1: Orientation Day for Grades K-6. ~ The children will not have school. Please inform me of any changes in your schedule to accommodate your orientation time for your children.

*Friday, September 2: Orientation Day for Kindergarten only. First day of school for Grades 1-6 ~ The kindergarten children will not have school. Please inform me of any changes in your schedule to accommodate your orientation time for your children.

School-Age Before/After School Confirmation

In the month of August, we will be sending out school-age before/after school care confirmation forms. Please fill them out and return the by the date requested. Our openings are limited.

Center Open House
