Now the big item I would like to touch on this month is our moving forward with "**The Story**" as our topic for Sunday School and for Adult Bible Study. There is more information on the table in the Narthex and inside this newsletter regarding this, but in short, "The Story" puts the Bible in chronological order to make it easier to follow and understand, and the entire congregation studies the same lesson each week. The other thing we are going to be doing is that starting the 17<sup>th</sup> of September the theme for all the Wednesday night services and the message that night will be based on the "The Story" lesson from the prior Sunday. I am really looking forward to this learning opportunity and I hope all of you will join in.

I know this time of year can be hectic and I know that when that happens sometimes we lose sight of our Lord and Savior. I encourage all of you to take a little time each day in prayer, devotion, or Scripture, in keeping our Lord's saving grace fresh in your mind. # **Stewardship Thoughts**



Transitions invite us to live in the present.... and the presence of God. - A. Ellis

Mid-September upnorth is a time of transition. We are caught between hanging on to summer and anticipating autumn. On the south side of the house, the hot sun warms our dining room. On the north side, a chilly lake breeze cools our bedroom. Green leaves start to blush. Hungry birds seek brittle oat heads. Apples hang with red ripeness. Thistle flowers weave fine fibers. Milkweed pods wait to be cracked. Sunflowers become seedplates. Bees sip sweet drinks. Geese flock together.

This shift of nature invites us to consider the gift of earthly time. To recall with gratitude the summer berries we picked, the picnics we enjoyed, the vacations we took, the long evenings we played, the mornings we slept late... but also acknowledge the forward movement of time.

Our senses respond to September's outward shift and our inner bones know colder days are coming. During times of change, the unchanging presence of God become even more precious: "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Heb. 13:8). For it was on an earth-bound cross that the eternal message of hope was set, and seasonal shifts do not wither or erase this promise.

I love mid-September. I love the fresh breeze. The new look of nature and the change of light. Let us remember to acknowledge each day that the Spirit of the God dwells among us. He offers sweet grace. He reworks disappointments for our good. He encourages us to hold hands in prayer and proclaim promises of hope. We are the apple of His eye. Every day is a special day in His presence.

### Keynote: REV. DR. PAUL L. MAIER

Dr. Paul L. Maier is the Russell H. Seibert Professor of Ancient History at Western Michigan University and a much-published author of both scholarly and popular works. His novels include two historical documentaries — *Pontius Pilate* and *The Flames of Rome-* as well as A Skeleton in God's Closet, a theological thriller that became a #1 national bestseller in religious fiction when it first released. *Sequels, More than a Skeleton* and *The Constantine Codex*, followed in 2003 and 2011.

Dr. Maier lectures widely, appears frequently on national radio, television, and newspaper interviews, and has received numerous awards. He has also penned seven children's books and hosted six video seminars dealing with Jesus, St. Paul, the early church, and current Christianity.

### Bible Study Leader: REV. DWAYNE LUECK

Rev. Lueck was born in Shelbyville, Illinois and grew up in Reedsburg, WI. He graduated from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis in 1979. He has served congregations in Nebraska and Oklahoma. In 1987 he received a call from the North Wisconsin District LCMS to serve in the position of Mission, Evangelism, and Stewardship Executive. In June 2012 he was elected President of the North Wisconsin District LCMS.

### **Entertainer: MARK A. SCHULTZ**

Mark A. Schultz currently serves as the Minister of Music at Trinity Lutheran Church in Wausau, Wisconsin. Mark has served for over 30 years as a Minister of Music for LCMS parishes in Wisconsin, Michigan, and Nebraska. He has also served as an Assistant Professor of Music and University Organist at Concordia University in Ann Arbor.

It was suggested to make the purchase of this organ as part of Zion's 130<sup>th</sup> anniversary recognition. Ellis made a motion to bring this organ information and opportunity to the Zion voters meeting on September 14<sup>th</sup>, second by Hebert. Motion carried.
